
Advocacy and technical leadership

Advocacy: Promoting Investment and Safety

We work tirelessly to secure sustainable pipelines of investment for road maintenance and to advocate for the safety of our road workers.

- Government Relations: Mapping key stakeholders and executing engagement plans to influence federal and state budgets.
- Position Papers: Developing data-supported papers on asset maintenance, resilience, and the economic benefits of bituminous pavements.

A network dedicated to providing the next generation of industry leaders with the opportunity to influence the sector and build career connections. Opportunities include a dedicated networking forums, mentorship, and participation in the AfPA ALTI Committee.

Recently published research



Sustainability Framework for Procurement (SF4P)

Scheduled for release in 2026, this updated framework enables Road Authorities and stakeholders to meet key sustainable procurement metrics. It provides the industry with quantifiable benchmarks to reduce environmental impacts during the tendering process for asphalt production and operations.



Low Carbon Innovations & Circular Economy Insights

Following the 2025 Forum on Low Carbon Innovations, AfPA published findings on the viability of Reclaimed Asphalt Pavement (RAP) and EME2 (high modulus asphalt). The research highlights case studies where EME2 achieved a 49% reduction in CO₂ emissions on major projects like the Hume Highway rehabilitation.



National Proficiency Testing Round 2025

This 2025 national undertaking provided AfPA members with a standardised benchmark for testing consistency. Covering seven streams—including binder extraction, resilient modulus, and wheel tracking—this initiative ensures high-level confidence in material testing across the Australian flexible pavement supply chain.



NSW & QLD Pre-Budget Submissions 2025-26

These policy papers advocate for 'Fixing it First', urging state governments to address the road resilience backlog. The research emphasises that sustainable, long-term maintenance pipelines are essential to prevent the degradation of regional networks and to support the national circular economy through crumb rubber and recycled plastic integration.



Safety Framework: Worker on Foot & Plant Interaction

Published in mid-2025, this technical guidance focuses on 'Separation of People from Plant.' It introduces nationally consistent baseline standards to safeguard workers from live traffic and mobile machinery, aligning with AfPA's goal to eliminate onsite fatalities and serious injuries.



Future Ready Roads: 20th International Conference Proceedings

Launched in October 2025, this collection of technical papers from the Adelaide Conference serves as the definitive source for cutting-edge pavement engineering. Key themes include the implementation of the AfPA LCA (Life Cycle Assessment) Calculator and innovations in bio-based binders that act as carbon sinks.

The Flexible Pavement Industry Skills Card: We are working closely with industry stakeholders and State Road Authorities to address critical skills shortages. The AfPA Skills Card provides a formal structure to identify, train, and qualify workers through trade-specific skill sets. These skill sets align with the Nationally Accredited Certificate III in Civil Infrastructure, ensuring that our workforce has the recognised expertise to deliver Australia's most valuable public assets.

Inclusion & Emerging Leaders

- **Women in Asphalt:** Part of our broader 'Women in Industry' initiative, this network promotes the achievements of women in the sector and creates platforms for mentorship and leadership development.
